

## Electing the Future March 18<sup>th</sup> 2015 World Café Conversations

## Overview

The "World Café" is a structured conversational process intended to facilitate open and intimate discussion, and link ideas within a larger group to access the collective wisdom in the room. At the Electing the Future event participants moved between a series of topics and tables where they discussed:

- 1. What we cherished about our past (focusing on Tooting)
- 2. Concerns for the present
- 3. Wishes for the future

A café ambience was created in order to facilitate conversation. Individuals were encouraged to speak and listen and a TTT host co- captured the essence of those discussions on paper as short actions

After the wishes, participants were given 5 dots and invited to vote on the action they felt most passionate about. The dots were counted and in true world café style, narrated back to the audience. These formed the basis of discussion with our panel of political candidates and representatives.

Since our earliest ancestors gathered in circles around the warmth of a fire, talking together has been our primary means for discovering common interests, sharing knowledge, imagining the future, and cooperating to survive and thrive.

The natural cross-pollination of relationships, ideas, and meaning as people moved from one conversation to others enabled us to learn, explore possibilities, and co-create a future together.

From this perspective, conversations are action that some will take away and bring to life.
